General Business Reports

Treasurer's Report: None tonight. Wishing Ralph a speedy recovery.

Membership Report: Total club membership is presently standing at 827 with a total revenue value of \$73,782.02. Membership demographics are as follows:

This past Saturday we had five former members come forward and renew their membership and we had 24 new members.

Public Relations Report: Nothing to add tonight.

Club Maintenance Report: So far in March the following work has been completed:

Rebuilt all targets on old range. Rebuilt all targets in the pistol pits. Rebuilt frames on five targets in the pistol pits. Rebuilt targets on new short range. Rebuilt targets on the 100-yard range. Emptied all garbage cans. Removed the old gate house and cremated its remains. Installed gravel around new gate house. Installed bark chips on old range on 14-yard and 25-yard targets. Weed eating around new short range. Picked up old targets left behind by lazy shooters—all ranges, and Rebuilt targets for future use.

NRA Membership: Tabled NRA Training: Tabled RSO Report: None

Hat Sales / Fund Raising: Tonight, we sold one hat. The raffle kitty is up to \$28.00 and the 50/50 is sitting at \$68.00.

Old Business

Larry Memmer, President, to review progress on transitioning members to new key-fob system: Just about everybody is up and running with the new keys. We only have a few hold outs. We have placed a second order for 1,000 additional fobs and will start issuing fobs to associate members when these fobs are received.

Ed Hilkey to review extension for short-range cover: Ed has submitted an estimate of \$2,100.00 for materials required to extend the short-range cover. Doug Smith made a motion for the membership to approve \$2,100.00 for materials, as requested by Facilities Superintendent Hilkey. The motion was seconded by Bob Gudmestad and

New Business

Club president Larry Memmer reviewed the current five-year plan as updated at the last board meeting.

As per the five-year plan, a request was made to approve funds to purchase 100 trees to finish out the perimeter boarder and to replace existing trees that have died. Plan is to replace twenty trees now and eighty more, as they become available. Estimated cost, \$2,500.00. Gary Raster made a motion to purchase 29 trees. The motion was seconded by Ron Martin and passed with a single dissenting vote by Randy Nolan.

Work Projects: Ed. Haven't, done anything for the past couple of weeks due to lack of transportation.

NRA Membership: Tabled—until further notice.

NRA Training: Tabled—until further notice.

RSO Report: Will need a couple of RSOs on 19 August to support Steve Wells church group. We will also need to hold a class to help the youth shooters, as discussed in this meeting. Larry would like Kelly to stress the stop the bleed class to the RSOs. We are now certified by the DoD to teach stop the bleed. Our certification will be good for two years. To date, Sigi Johnson has taught over 100 people.

Old Business

Facilities Superintendent report on schedule and progress on extending the cover for the shout range: Ed is waiting on Ralph to fund the project.

Facilities Superintendent report on estimates for concrete blocks to stabilize the berm for ranges 6 and 7: Ed received an estimate from Berg Vaults of about \$5,000.00, but only for one row high. To extend to two rows high will require 77 blocks. Ed is getting a bid for the 3'X2'X2' blocks which are less expensive but would require twice as many blocks. The small blocks still weigh 2,500 pounds each. Berg will sit them in a pile, and we will have to place them. Ed is checking into using railroad ties with dead men. Discussed renting a track hoe for a one-day use for block placement.

Ron Martin made a motion which was seconded by Alex Jackson to buy the big blocks (6'X2'X2'), which will cost \$9,968.80, and rent an excacvator to place the blocks. Estimated cost for the excavator will be \$1,800.00 for two days. We will take it to the general membership for a sustaining vote. Passed by members



Status and discussion of 29 tree purchase and planting schedule: Waiting on Ralph to cut a check.

Status of steel plate replacement project: Al thinks the plates are pretty good, as is. They are bowed a bit, but all we need to do is turn them around and shoot the other side. This project was placed on hold. The plates Mike Cox was talking about getting were for the three-gun match. When we do spend money on new plates we do need to buy AR550 steel.

Candidates for replacement of Mike Cox on the board: Currently, we have two candidates: TJ Lamont and Ralph Downs that have thrown their hats in the ring for this board position. We will hold an election at the next general meeting. Larry mentioned that we also talked about having two vice presidents VP 1 and VP 2 in the future to aid in leadership training.


New Business

Alex Jackson suggested we could convert the old rendezvous area into a member primitive camping area. Could be a good DE truant against homeless people coming onto the range.

Al Lindell asks how we control the range, with the new security system, if we leave the gate open for matches. In the old system people had to sign in, but now with the electronic system we can't keep track of who is coming and going. Kirby asks how many people that come to matches are nonmembers. Al reports that there are only a few. It was suggested that we post a policy that anyone coming through the gate, even if the gate is already open, swipe their membership fob to record their entrance and exit of the range. President Memmer will post a policy in the upcoming newsletter.

Steve Wells made a request for his church's (the Family Bible Church) men's group to use the range on 19 August for a BBQ and some shooting. They would like to use ranges 9 and 10 with some pistol shooting on range 9 and rifle shooting on range 10. They are expecting less than thirty participants. Their plan is to come to the club house at around 10:00 and explain the range rules and inform shooters that if there are any rules infractions that guilty parties will be escorted off the property. They plan to shoot pistol in the morning, have a BBQ around noon, and finish up the day with some rifle

shooting. They should be all wrapped up by 15:00 in the afternoon. They are planning on cooking the BBQ behind the ranges but would like to use the club house to plug in some crock pots to keep some dishes warm. Conditions for use:



- Steve will need to coordinate with Kelly for additional RSO support.
 Steve is an RSO and is planning to act in that role during the shooting.
- Steve will need to contact Susan and reserve 19 August on the calendar.
- In addition, he will need to contact Bill Balfour to get a notice in the E-mail blast.

Finally, Kirby made a motion to accept Steve's proposal for range use on 19 August by the Family Bible Church men's group. The motion was seconded by Doug Smith and passed by the board.

Victor Zarate (a former club member) also presented the board with a request for range use. Victor is the President of the Sabertooth Shooting Squad Junior Marksman Shooting Club. Victor is requesting the board to allow youth shooters to come to the range to practice their skills at shooting small-bore target rifles. Dave Goodman (also a former member) is the group's coach, and he would be participating with the youth shooters. Victor anticipates that they would have two to three shooters coming to the range once or twice a week as they prepare for their regional and national matches. The youth and adults are willing to come to the range and participate in club sponsored service projects. Our suggestions are that Victor and Dave Goodman renew their membership and bring the youth to the range. Additional suggestions and requirements:

- Both Steve and Dave Goodman work with Kelly and become qualified RSOs. Kelly will work with them and schedule an RSO training class.
- All youth shooters will need to have a CWSA release form signed by their parents prior to using the range.
- A letter from Victor to the board is included in the Appendix A.
