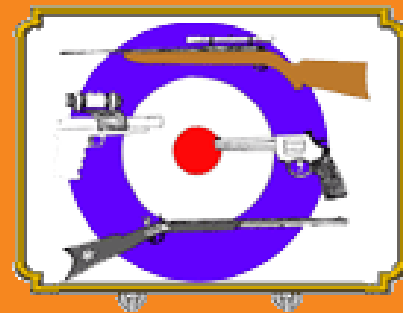

Below are the requirements for each position and if you volunteer you will not have to pay dues or complete a working party. The way it's set up in the new bylaws the president position is only two years long with an Identified relief by the first Vice President! Please see below! Section A: PRESIDENT

The President shall preside over all meetings of the CWSA and the Executive Committee. He/she shall be an ex-officio member of all regular and special committees. He/she shall perform all such duties as usually pertain to the office, including assuring that all members, officers, and employees perform their duties in a businesslike manner. He/she shall act promptly upon receipt of any correspondence or other action items received in his/her capacity as president. The president will assign a member of the club to hold orientation for new members. The President is a 2-year term who will be relieved by Vice President -1 when his/her term is up unless the president wants to extend their term and is approved by the Board of directors and the executive committee.

Section B: VICE PRESIDENT-1

The Vice President-1 (VP-1) shall perform the duties of president in his/her absence or at his/her request. The VP-1 shall also conduct such regular and special duties and activities deemed appropriate by the president or the membership. The VP-1 shall also coordinate the activities of all the various elected or appointed committees to include setting up and coordinating the annual charity match. The VP-1 will relieve the president when the president's 2-year term is up unless the president extends their oath of office at which time the VP-1 can choose to end his/her position or extend their position as well. The VP-1 will fill in for the Secretary in their absence.

Section C: VICE PRESIDENT -2

The Vice President-2 (VP-2) Shall perform duties of the (VP-1) in his/her absence. The VP-2 shall also carry out such regular and special duties and activities deemed appropriate by the president or the membership. The VP-2 will replace VP-1 when VP-1 vacates the position. The VP-2 will chair the auditing committee along with 2 middle directors and 1 officer to conduct an audit of the clubs' finances in June and in December, using records provided by the treasurer: to include account books, cancelled checks, invoices, deposits, and sources of monies available to the Executive Committee. The semiannual audits shall ascertain the status of the treasury for budgetary forecasting. The June audit will report to the membership its finding in July and the December audit will report at the January or February general meeting with the treasurer giving his annual report to club members, The VP2 will fill in for the Membership Secretary in their absence.

Membership Report: 19 New members on 9 September, for a total of 150 new members for the year bringing total membership for 2023 to 918 members. There will be no more orientations this year as we start preparing for membership in 2024 season starting 1 November.

Public Relations Report: Bill Balfour continues doing a great job with email blast on Thursday's getting the word out.

Club Maintenance Report: Sunday 9 members showed up and rehabbed the 100 Yard range, and on Wednesday 6 members showed up and weed wacked around the club house and tractor shed, pick up trash.

NRA Membership: Linda Pickering will renew and signup NRA memberships before the general meetings until we can get a volunteer to relieve her.

Old Business

General Business Reports

Reading of Previous Minutes: Previous minutes posted online.

Treasurer: Raph stated that we received an unexpected bill from our insurance company, Liberty Mutual, that was \$1000.00 higher than expected, bringing our property insurance to \$2827.00 per year. Ralph will be meeting with our agent to get to the bottom of this increase. We will spend \$3875.46 for our annual subscription fee to EZ-Facility. This is a 6% increase over last year. People looking at our financial reports will find them a little strange because we get most of our revenue in November and December.

Membership: So far this year we have 151 new members. Regular members 447 with a total membership of 915.

Public Relations: Bill is continuing to get the Thursday E-mail blast out.

Work Projects: Gary had a group of guys rework 16 of the targets on the 100-yard range

NRA Membership: Linda will start selling NRA membership at our general meetings, until we find a replacement.

NRA Training: We had ten people do the NRA instructor class. It cost \$2409.00 and with the \$50.00 that each student paid cost the cost to the Club was \$1909.00 to have the guys from Kenmoore come down and teach the class. We will start doing pistol and rifle courses soon. We will give out the books, but people will have to buy the book ahead of the class with NRA.

RSO Report: Kelly has a list of new RSOs. Larry read in the list of new RSOs for this year. We had good signups for the classes.

Old Business

Charity match volunteers needed for 7 October from 08:30 to 13:00. Larry has all of the volunteers we need to run the match. Ron has ordered the turkeys and Gary will pick them up. Al and Larry have already signed up for RSO duty.

Randy Pike set up a signup sheet for adopt-a-range. Doug suggests putting slots on the signs to allow us to easily change the name of the person assigned to each range.

Review results of NRA instructor class and cost to club. Four people took the class and we collected \$1809.18. There was a flat rate of \$50.00. The instructors taught five classes in three days.

New Business

Presentation and ratification of bylaws. Approved by the board.

Ron Martin suggests that we contact Holms harbor to have a joint match or shoot to get to know their club members. Al said that in the past we used to do something with Holms Harbor and North Whidbey every year.

Dave Breining suggests that we set up a Bullseye shoot.

Ron Martin has purchased \$550.00 worth of patches for the club. Ron will be selling the patches at our general meeting. The patches will sell for around 10 to 12\$ each. Ron will pick them up next week.

Last meeting Alex Jackson asked if we could start opening the club for members to camp on the facilities. There was some discussion and some concern about our liability. The discussion didn't go very far and was tabled.

Al brings up that we have a problem with cancellation of matches. People that are running matches need to ensure that everyone involved knows that a match is going to be cancelled.

Larry introduced Ed Green as a new board member. Ed was welcomed by the committee.

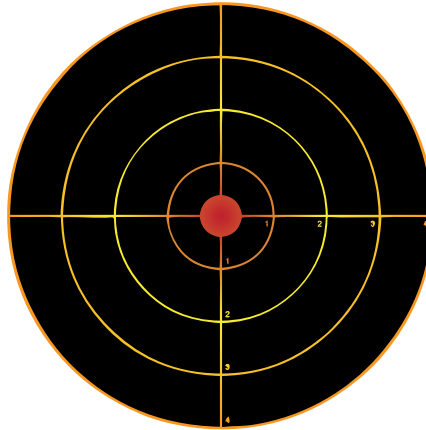
