Addressing Safety Concerns and Accountability

At the last meeting, it was brought to our attention that someone shot a hole in the roof of the short range. The damage appears to have been caused by a large-caliber projectile, which not only punctured the roof but also caused structural damage to a support beam. Incidents like this are deeply concerning for several reasons.

First and foremost, we need to emphasize that this kind of negligence is entirely unacceptable. Equally concerning is the fact that the incident was not reported, which delayed the necessary repairs and posed a potential safety risk for all who use the range.

We all understand that mistakes can happen, and while they are unfortunate, they also provide opportunities for growth and learning. Owning up to these mistakes is a critical part of responsible firearm ownership. A failure to take accountability for one's actions is particularly troubling in an environment where safety and responsibility must always come first.

If anyone has information about this incident, we urge you to come forward and contact any board member. Transparency and accountability are key to maintaining the safety and integrity of our club, and we appreciate your cooperation in addressing this matter.

General Business Reports

Secretary, Reading of Previous Minutes: Previous minutes are available online.

Treasurer's Report: Ralph Young was away tonight; however, Bob reported that we successfully converted our CD to a new ladder and obtained a reasonable interest rate.

Membership Report: Larry Memmer was also away this evening. At present, we have 360 members that are paid in full. Bob reminded everyone present that we need to renew our membership by 31 December without incurring a late fee.

Public Relations Report: Not present tonight.

Club Maintenance Report: Ed Hilkey reported that by February or March he will do a complete rework of the 100-yard range. Almost everything else has been updated. However, we need to rework the target stands on range eight.

NRA Membership: Nothing new.

NRA Training: Scott and Bob will teach one NRA class this year to retain our status with NRA. The class will probably be a basic pistol class. The big thing for members to keep in mind is that completion of one of these NRA classes provides a portable certificate that is good nation wide.

RSO Report: Nothing to report; however, we did have a hole shot in the short-range roof. Looks like a shotgun slug. Nick thinks that a video surveillance system would help identify some of these problems. We are hoping that the perpetrator comes forward and admits guilt.

Hat Sales / Fund Raising: Linda reports that we had no hat sales tonight and that the 50/50 is up to \$9.00 which will make some lucky member \$4.50 richer.

Old Business

Review new information on bullet traps for the ranges: Bob displayed some bullet traps that he has researched; however, these are very expensive. Possibly we could fabricate something similar to these commercial units ourselves. We will continue to research this topic.

Ron Martin: Information learned on lead mining. Ron passed a contact to Ed. Ed will try and call the Colorado firm tomorrow to get an estimate. Bob thinks the old short range will be the best place to start mining lead, since it has been in use for a longer time. Al Lindell thinks the pin range would also be a good place to start.

New Business

Discussion on carpet replacement: Bob received an estimate of \$9,750.00 to remove the old carpet and replace it with new carpet. This

is for commercial grade carpet—not residential grade. The quote also includes removal and disposal of the existing carpet.

Do we want to paint the clubhouse interior prior to carpet replacement? Bob presented the idea of painting the clubhouse prior to any carpet replacement. Most members were in agreement with the idea of painting prior to carpet replacement. All of this is simply for informational use only at this time. Further study will be required.
