

CWSA General Meeting Minutes Date: 13 January 2025

General Business Reports

Secretary, Reading of Previous Minutes: Previous minutes are available online.

Treasurer's Report: We ended 2024 with \$235,658.00 in the bank. The club realized \$121,000 in revenue last year and our expenses were \$56,477.00. The club put an additional \$55,449.00 in the bank. This is a record year for the club. We have two CDs that matured last year. We rolled these CDs over into new CDs worth \$103.918.00 at a 4% interest rate. In the past two months we have realized about \$9,000.00 in renewal revenue. However, we still have 140 members that have not renewed as yet, which puts us short about \$10,000.00.

Membership Report: Presently, we have 953 members, but we will lose 140 members that have not renewed their contracts, resulting in a total membership of 815. We should gain more members on Jan 25th.

Public Relations Report: Not present at the meeting.

Club Maintenance Report: Ed reports bunch of work completed on Range 9. Also, rebuilt the back boards on the 200-yard range and totally rebuilt the 100-yard range. We have placed new gongs on ranges 1 and 5. On Thursday ranges 6,7, and 8 will be closed for new gravel placement.

NRA Membership: Nothing to report.

NRA Training: Scott is going to get some classes started. If anyone is interested give him a call. Scott will get back to Bob with a tentative date in March or April.

RSO Report: Nick reports that we did get an incident report from Al Lindell. Someone shot a hole in the Plexiglas shield at the Pin range.

Hat Sales / Fund Raising: We took in 15\$ for the 50/50 raffle. The raffle generated \$33.00. Also, Linda sold one hat and one patch for a total of \$83.00.

Old Business

Review plans for bullet traps. Ed and Bob will try and see if they can get something going this Spring.

Ed Hilkey: Report on findings for mining lead from our berms. Tabled until the next board meeting.

Present plans to paint the clubhouse interior. Bob has priced paint and it is running at \$286.00 per 5 gallon bucket. We want egg shell for the walls.

Review plans for replacing the clubhouse carpet and blinds. Most folks are leaning to the green square. Bob wants to make a firm decision so that we can move forward. Hopefully having the job completed by 15 April. Kay made a motion to go with the tan squares. Larry seconded the motion. We will go with the tan color. The cost for the carpet should be \$9741.53

Ed Hilkey: Review plans to replace clubhouse doors and provide the

schedule for this work. Bob would like to see this completed by 15 April. Ed will replace the four exterior doors for the clubhouse. This needs to be done before the painting and carpeting.

Bob Clark: Discuss our agreement with State Parks on facility use. Bob and Ryan Green of State Parks have met and worked out a memorandum of agreement (MOA). The understanding is that the 200- yard range and ranges 6, 7, and 9 will be open for member use. All other ranges and the clubhouse will be closed to members during State parks use. However, board members will be able to access the clubhouse to accomplish necessary work. Bob will secure final signatures on the MOA by next board meeting.

Clubhouse blinds. Bob feels that we don't want to replace the blinds because the existing blinds are a custom size (76 inches). A member (Angile Graham) thinks she can get an estimate by Wednesday or Thursday. Do we want to add blinds for the back part of the room, that currently don't have blinds. Angile will check the pricing. Blind discussion tabled to the next board meeting.

New Business

Discussion on changes to the 50/50 raffle. Kirby will generate a list of names from EZ-Facilities. Linda will use this list to come up with a name of the raffle winner. If the winner is not present the pot will continue to grow. New process explained to general membership.

Gary Raster brought up that there are several new bills coming up before the legislature limiting gun rights. Bob read a letter to Ron Muzzall that one of our members wrote in name of the club. Bob will forward this letter to Ron Muzzall.

Closing

CWSA Board Meeting Minutes

General Business Reports

Reading of Previous Minutes: Previous minutes are posted online.

Treasurer: We currently have \$143,913.57 in available cash. Our CDs have a current value of \$103,989.05 for a total of \$247,902.60

Membership: As of this morning we had 868 members, and we gained one more this evening bringing us up to 869 members. We processed 53 people on Saturday and three more on Thursday.

Public Relations: Bill is not available tonight

Work Projects: We got quite a bit done this week. The new gravel is in and all smoothed out in bay 8. We put a new road into bay 5 that will provide access to handicap members. The 17-yard and 50-yard ranges (old) both need new target boards.

NRA Membership: Nothing new to report.

NRA Training: Nothing new to report.

RSO Report: Not much to report. Have had some people driving through the area at excessive speeds. The new eyebrows on the short range seem to be increasing the noise level. The 75-yard range has a bunch of divots in the ground short of the targets. Which raises concerns for ricochet problems.

Old Business

Ed Hilkey: Report on findings of lead mining research. Yes. Ed is working with two people, one back East. His process includes drilling a hole in the ground and circulating water in the ground and then extracting the lead from the water. The other guy has not given us a final decision. Ed found that we need to have this done this year due to an agreement we have with the county.

Bob Clark: Report on Angile Graham's estimate to replace clubhouse window blinds. She estimates that we could replace all of the blinds except the large one for \$576.44 and the one big window would cost \$314.00. The big window would be metal blinds and the others would be vinal. These windows would be inside mount and would still show our woodwork. Larry made a motion to purchase the windows Nick provided the second and the motion passed. We will take it to the membership for approval at the next general meeting.

Bob Clark: Discussion on door changes. Ed reports that our doors will be in by 1 February. Will be installed by 15 February. We will need to start getting all of the stuff off of the walls in preparation of painting. Bob would like to get this done in March.

March 3 Ralph Downs and Ron Martin will remove all of the stuff off the walls including the old blinds.

Bob Clark: Discussion on painting of clubhouse interior

Bob Clark: Discussion on changes to counter situation. Ralph Downs likes the islands. We use them a lot for training and anytime someone does some cooking they are heavily used. The board votes to keep the island in place.

Bob Clark: Report on finalization of MOA with State Parks on range use. Done. Bob wants a sign for the gate to explain which ranges are available when state parks are using the range for training.

New Business

Ralph Young: Presentation of 2025 CWSA budget Proposal to raise the cleaning fee by 7% motion passed.

Recommendations on mounting the moose antlers on the wall. We have a skull hanger and need to find a place to mount Bullwinkle. The guy from Whidbey Taxidermy says that we should get rid of the ram. Ralph feels that the domestic ram is an embarrassment. Whidbey Taxidermy will take it and give it to Oak Harbor Schools.

Ralph Young: Draft proposal to change CWSA fiscal year. The reason is that membership dues are currently due at the end of the calendar year. This presents a problem for some members due to additional expenses during the holidays. This year we lost 139 members. Last year we lost 60. We have been tossing around the idea of having the year on 1 March. Ralph has talked to EZ-Facilities about this, and they are working on it. Ralph Downs suggests that 1 April would also be a good date. This is the membership year. Not really the fiscal year. This discussion was tabled until the next board meeting.

Ralph Downs: Discussion on portable trap thrower. The trap thrower is getting old and not working too well. Ralph wants to know how many people use the thrower. Ralph thinks that a replacement would run about \$1,800.00. Ralph would like us to put a notice in the newsletter to ask how many people use it. Ed thinks it is used at a minimum of once per week, when the weather is good. Kirby made a motion to replace the unit. The motion was seconded by Larry Memmer and passed by the membership. We will ask the membership for \$2000.00

Bill Simon wants to replace the archery targets. The two small targets this year and the big target next year. The two targets will cost \$326.00. Gary made a motion to replace the targets. The motion was seconded by Ed Hilkey and passed unanimously.

Ed needs to fix the signs on ranges 1 through 5. We need to repaint the safety lines on the ranges and build new benches for 7 and 8. In addition, Ed wants to build three new shooting tables for range 9. We are having problems with people that are moving the tables on the 100-yard range. They move the tables to accommodate shootin in a prone position, which is OK. The problem is that they are leaving the tables out in the weather which is damaging the wood.

Alex wants a sign on Range 6 stating that the range is for shotgun only. Kevin Kirkpatric introduced himself Wants to donate his service. Has
